Focus on our organization

A.V.E.S is a non-governmental organization created in 2001 by multidisciplinary groups of development actors who were met to think on the development issues in sub-Saharan Africa, particularly in Togo. Its aim is to fight against poverty by fulfilling the Sustainable Development Goals axed on basic social services ameliorating, economy and self-promotion improvement and environment protection.

Its actions

Project for access to drinking water and the promotion and inclusion of women

The NGO AVES is helping vulnerable groups to gain access to drinking water, especially in rural areas where water shortages create a gender equity gap. To achieve this, installing water supply infrastructure and training are becoming a strategy for women's self-promotion.

Project for women's contribution to food security through healthy agriculture

The NGO AVES trains women in healthy agriculture in order to reduce poverty and economic insecurity. The women produce bio-inputs (bio-pesticides and bio-fertilisers). This enables them to develop their agricultural production in a healthy and environmentally-friendly way, especially market gardening, which is used directly in food production.



Project for women involved in restoring forest landscapes

The NGO AVES is supporting women in the restoration of degraded land through the implementation of participatory agri-environmental governance plans. To implement these plans, women are actively involved in setting up tree nurseries, planting and maintaining reforested areas.

They take part in agro-forestry campaigns and in promoting the use of non-timber forest resources such as bee-keeping, pepper picking, etc.











Women's empowerment project for social and climate justice

The NGO AVES empowers and mobilises women to play an active role in environmental management. They take part in climate, social and environmental justice campaigns through public health, waste management and sanitation activities. They initiate public and community awareness campaigns to change behaviour in terms of keeping our cities clean
